MAJOR SCIENTIFIC ACHIEVEMENTS

I have published over 300 papers (H index 55: Web of Science 2022) and authored or edited 14 books. I obtained over 4.5 Mill. Swiss Francs in grants.

My principal areas of interest have been: Trauma and stress-related disorders: PTSD, Prolonged Grief Disorder, Adjustment Disorder; Mental disorders of the elderly; Electronic mental health; Cultural clinical psychology

Trauma and stress-related disorders: PTSD, Complex PTSD, Prolonged Grief Disorder, Adjustment Disorder

My research groups and I contributed to assessment, classification, epidemiology, etiology and treatment (psychotherapy). In assessment, we established and validated one of the global Gold Standards in the field the 'Impact of Event Scale-Revised' in German language and collaborated in its validation for other languages. Main contributions to the field are the 'Socio-interpersonal framework model of PTSD' including the development of relevant self-report questionnaires (Dysfunctional disclosure; Social acknowledgment as victim or survivor).

My research groups also researched on non-pathological outcomes of traumatic stress and its predictors. Main achievements were the 'Janus-Face-Model of Posttraumatic Growth' that had been substantiated by own as well as international research. Furthermore, we developed and validated a revised version of a resilience facet measure, the 'Sense of Coherence-Revised'.

In the joined process of the development of proposals for new disorders for the International Classification of Diseases—version 11 at WHO, I co-developed the new clinical definitions and diagnostic guidelines of PTSD, Complex PTSD, Prolonged Grief Disorder, and Adjustment Disorder (remodeled diagnosis—following a new model developed in my research group over the years).

In the area of treatment for these disorders, my research groups contributed to multimodal cognitivebehavioral treatment development as well as to introducing structured life-review in treating PTSD in old age as a form of narrative exposure.

Mental disorders of the elderly

My research groups contributed to epidemiology, risk factor identification, and treatment mainly of PTSD, depressive disorders, and early stages of Alzheimer's Dementia. In epidemiology, we contributed nationally representative prevalence estimates of these disorders in the 2000's and 2010's in Germany and Switzerland. For Alzheimer's Dementia we developed the risk-factor model of 'Motivational Reserve Capacity' and applied it successfully in various large-scale studies in Switzerland and Germany. In treatment, a large intervention study (RCT) on patients with Mild Cognitive Impairment or early stage Alzheimer's and their caregivers was conducted that substantiated positive effects on quality of life and well-being parameters of the participants.

Electronic mental health

These more recent research topics are embedded in extensive international networks of collaborating research groups and organizations (e.g., WHO). We co-developed online treatment programs for PTSD, Prolonged Grief Disorder, Adjustment Disorder, depression in general and in particular in old age. Within a network of US and Chinese research groups we took the lead to introduce and evaluate "My trauma recovery" in Mandarin language. For the new WHO e-mental health program "PM+" we are the leading house for its translation and cultural adaptation into Arab language. A new program development is an intervention for loneliness in old age.

Cultural clinical psychology

Cultural clinical psychology research began with systematically investigating the associations of cultural value orientations (defined sensu S. Schwartz) and prevalences or clinical presentations of several mental disorders. It showed explanatory power for cultural differences relevant for the disorders. More recent basic research investigates cultural conditions and contexts of mainstream disorder models in indigenous populations in various parts of the world. The leading question is: how far should we incorporate cultural adaptations of existing diagnostic and treatment tools into global practice? Since 2021, I have been working on a book project on Historical Trauma and the means of its empirical investigation. The latest project, in the form of an international collaboration, explores the differences and similarities of cultural scripts of trauma sequelae expression.
